To Be + number + years old

- I am 23 years old.
- You are 16 years old.
- He is 32 years old.
- Mary is 45 years old.

Years old is optional.
You can say:

- I am 18 years old. $O R$
- I am 18.

BUT... years + old are always together

- Iam 21.
- I am 21 years.
- I am 21 years old.

You can write the age as numbers or as words.

- I am 12 years old.
- I am twelve years old.

He is forty years old. She is 36 .
The grandfather


3 years old. 5 months old.
With babies, you can use months instead of years.

- The baby is 4 months old.
- She is nine months old.

Be Careful - In English we use the verb TO BE and not another verb.

- I have 18. - I am 18.
- I have 18 years.
- I have 18 years old.
- I am 18 years old.

The Question: How old are you? - I'm $\qquad$ years old.
