

Present Progressive Tense

What is it?

A way to use verbs to talk about the present.

When do I use it?

1. When you want to talk about something that is happening **right now**.

Example: The kids in the park are laughing **right now**.

2. When you are talking about something you plan to do in **the future**

Example: He is going to his sister's house **next week**

subject	+ correct form of "to be"	+ verb ending in -ing
I	am	walking
you	are	eating
he/she/it	is	sleeping
we	are	doing
they	are	writing
