Beginner Week 7 Vocabulary Present Progressive Tense

Use the present progressive tense to talk about something that a person is doing **now**.

For the present progressive tense, use: a form of "to be" (am, is, are) + a verb ending in "-ing"

Example:

Simple present tense: I wash the dishes every night.

Present progressive tense: I *am washing* the dishes right now.

Verb	Present Progressive Tense	Question	Answer
Do	Doing	What are they doing?	They are doing their homework.
Cook	Cooking	What is he doing?	He <i>is cooking</i> spaghetti.
Drink	Drinking	What is she doing?	She <i>is drinking</i> water.
Eat	Eating	What is he doing?	He <i>is eating</i> cereal.

Hold	Holding	What is she doing?	She <i>is holding</i> the baby.
Bake	Baking	What is she doing?	She <i>is baking</i> cookies.
Read	Reading	What is she doing?	She <i>is reading</i> a book.
Wear	Wearing	What is he doing?	He <i>is wearing</i> a mask.
Fix	Fixing	What is he doing?	He <i>is fixing</i> his bike.
Study	Studying	What are they doing?	They are learning English.

Play	Playing	What is she doing?	
			She <i>is playing</i> soccer.
